HEADS UP! WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR HELMET!

We all know that we should wear helmets. We have all heard the statistics involving the dangers of riding without a helmet. Yet, many of us STILL choose not to wear helmets.

The truth is that wearing helmets IS NOT enough! It is EXTREMELY important to maintain your helmets and REPLACE them in the event of a fall, or yearly due to significant use.

Helmets work because there is

Styrofoam inside that absorbs concussion. Unfortunately, the foam can only absorb so much concussion before it is no longer beneficial.

Dropping your helmet on the ground, tossing it against the wall in the process of hanging it up, or, my favorite, leaving it on the floor of the tack room (to use as a soccer ball) are all reasons to consider replacing your helmet.

Please be advised that Jessica Bein, Bein Performance Horses, and all persons involved with educating students suggests, encourages, and recommends that students wear safe & updated helmets. Furthermore, Bein Performance Horses also goes to great lengths to maintain the highest level of safety by replacing helmets regularly.

STALL GAURDS

Do you miss seeing your horses head peek out at you when you get to the barn? Is your horse one that would prefer to be more social?

For anyone who would like to leave their horses stall open, either at home, or away at the shows (sometimes show grounds have VERY hot, stuffy stalls) here is your chancel

Stall guards will be available

at approximately \$100— \$150, depending on the length of your horses name.

We will install the appropriate hardware in the horses stall, if you wish to get one.

Horses that get a stall guard will have their stalls open in the morning, and shut in the afternoon. Horses should not be left unattended when the stall guards are in place.

If you are interested, please take the time to discuss it with Jessica to make sure that this will benefit your horse. Some horses will not be indulged by the luxury of a new stall guard for safely reasons.
